Restorative Nursing: The NHA's Role and Organizational ...

With any effective restorative nursing program comes the necessity of documentation excellence. A key concept to keep in mind when building a restorative nursing program and documenting the program for each resident is that the program must occur at least six days each week for at least 15 minutes each day.

Utilizing Restorative Nursing Programs to Optimize ...

• Range of motion must be delivered by staff who are trained in the procedure • The use of continuous passive motion (CPM) devices in a restorative nursing program is coded when the following criteria are met: (1) ordered by a physician, (2) nursing staff have been trained in technique, and (3) monitoring of the device. ○ Nursing staff should document the application of the devices and the effects on the resident

Documentation Requirements □A registered nurse or a licensed practical (vocational) nurse must supervise the activities in a restorative nursing program. Sometimes, under licensed nurse supervision, other staff and volunteers will be assigned to work with specific residents. □Restorative nursing does not require a physician's order.
